



## Smallpox Vaccine System SVS

### Description

The Smallpox Vaccine System Program provides both the ACAM2000™ smallpox vaccine and the Vaccinia Immune Globulin, Intravenous (VIGIV) to vaccinate and protect the warfighter from potential exposure to smallpox. Both products are Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved. The Department of Defense's (DoD) ACAM2000™ requirement is being met through an Interagency Agreement with the Department of Health and Human Services, under which the DoD draws upon supplies held within the Strategic National Stockpile (SNS). The DoD transfers funds provided by the Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense Health Affairs, TRICARE Management Activity to the SNS to maintain a DoD stock from which smallpox vaccine is drawn. VIGIV is used to treat rare but serious adverse reactions associated with vaccination with ACAM2000™, and DoD maintains its own supply of VIGIV, also held within the SNS.



### Mission

Provide protection against exposure to smallpox. VIGIV provides protection against complications of smallpox vaccine immunizations.
